# ABE KIDNAPPED, ASSAULTED, FIXED, PROTECTED, AND READY TO REASSUME HIS POSITION

One night last June before graduation, seven individuals in their late teens paid a visit to HVRHS. What apparently started out as a prank turned into something more serious when the statue of Abraham Lincoln was not only removed to the oval in front of the school but damaged severely. Abe had been presented to the school by The Hotchkiss School in 1939 to honor Housatonic's status as the first regional high school in New England. Over the years, like the great White Oak in the senior courtyard, Abe became a symbol of their high school experience to years and years of alumni.

But our grads are not the only ones who feel strongly about the venerable old statue. Peter Vermilyea, Department Head of Social Studies. brought the story of Abe's downfall to a meeting of the Civil War Roundtable in Torrington. At the end of the meeting, a friend from Vermont came up to Pete and said, "I've got just the guy for you." He was referring to the accomplished sculptor Larry Nowlan of Windsor, VT. Mr. Nowlan agreed to take on the delicate task of restoring the statue and to do it for only the cost of materials! When Pete Vermilyea and others drove up for a visit in July, they found that Abe was progressing nicely. By about the first of October, he was ready to return to HVRHS.

It had not taken long to apprehend the perpetrators. They were identified in time to prevent the three who were seniors from participating in graduation. Two others had graduated in 2001; there was an underclasman, and another had never attended Housatonic. Per the outcome of their day in court, they are paying for the



damage they did. Donations to the cause by alumni (thanks to all who donated, especially to the classes of '51 and '52) will be used to protect the statue from future harm by enclosing it in a glass case. Sheldon Glass of Lime Rock is now at work on the project, which calls for thick safety glass.

The individual who swung an uprooted mailbox at the statue's head was quoted as having said, "I wanted one last swing at Abe, and it got a little out of hand. Abe's done." Well, no, young man, Abe is not "done" because the Housatonic community would not stand for it.

The angels in this case are Peter Vermilyea, whose initiative made the restoration possible; Larry Nowlan for his skill and generosity; and **Bunny McGuire**, who, as usual, was at the center of it all.
