






Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mechanics (STEM)

he long-awaited official opening of the Mahoney-Hewat Science and Technology Center occurred during a ceremony attended by more than 100 people in October. It is named for the late Jack Mahoney, longtime HVRHS teacher and principal, and Diane and Don Hewat, strong supporters of the 21st Century Fund. Diane served on its board at one time. This is a direct result of the group's mission to fund innovative and creative programs that engage and inspire kids.

The 6,000-square-foot LEED-qualified green building was converted from the former Clarke B. Wood Agricultural Center through the efforts of the 21st Century Fund, whose members raise private funds for programs not part of the school's budget. They came up with the idea that such a center could provide many opportunities for the region's students and spearheaded an all-out effort to save the building from destruction eleven years ago.





A traditional rural supper was held at L'Érablière du Lac Beauport... a 300-year old farm dating back to 1608. These are just the highlights of a trip that should prove to be a pleasant memory for many years.

n the fall of 1976 David Seney began the first of his 37 years of service here at HVRHS. During his tenure, he taught all areas of Technology Education: Wood Technology, Metal Technology, Production Graphics, Drafting & Electronic Publishing, Computer Aided Drafting, Beginning Black & White Photography, Advanced Black & White Photography, Power Technology, Life Skills, and Electricity & Electronics (in the early years).

He was also involved in a variety of activities outside the classroom such as working with the Housatonic Musical Theatre Society in producing play posters, programs, tickets, and props; serving as advisor to HVRHS Technology Student Association;



a member of the HVRHS Safety Committee; member of the HVRHS Faculty Association Undergraduate Scholarship Committee; worked with students to design & produce Prom tickets, invitations, and bids; assisted HVRHS Alumni Association in publish their newsletter twice a year; and many other school projects too numerous to list. He also taught courses in the HVRHS Adult Education program for many years.

According to Dave, what changed the most over those 37 years was the use of technology. When he first started teaching, computers used punched cards to do their work. There were not many classroom applications. The machines were very expensive and

slow. Mimeograph machines were used to make photocopies. There were very few phones available to call outside of the school building, film projectors were used to show movies, instructional filmstrips, records & cassette tapes for audio, to mention just a few changes. He said the one constant was the great students and community support that we are fortunate to have here in Region One, along with our exceptional staff and educational programs available to all students.

As the years progressed, he found students to be generally kinder to each other and more respectful. He believes today's students are more sophisticated and have even greater opportunities than ever before.



His fondest memories are of watching students grow and mature from shy, little freshmen to bigger, often more mature seniors. He enjoys seeing former students in the community with successful careers and families. He also took pleasure in having students leave one of the Tech Ed Labs with a project they worked hard to produce and were proud of. Another highlight was having his daughter and son attend Housatonic and watch them receive their diplomas at the commencement exercises.

He will miss the faculty and staff that he worked closely with over the years as well as the students. He most definitely will not miss calculating grades, the never-ending paperwork, and the many meetings. He looks forward to working on many home projects and being able to devote more time to his hobbies such as gardening, woodworking, photography, maple sugaring, and plans to continue as a firefighter & EMT with Falls Village Volunteer Fire Department. His parting advice to students is to "work hard and always keep trying even when things get difficult. Set your goals

and standards high and don't let anyone tell you can't achieve them! Keep smiling and have a good sense of humor!"
