The above list only skims the surface of 35 years of outstanding local service to education in this district. As a graduate of our Housatonic High School, "Ed" returned from military service as an elementary teacher in Cornwall, then shortly afterwards moved up to the high school as science teacher, coach, and, later, Athletic Director. Football and basketball coaching successes were soon overshadowed by his love for and success at coaching baseball, to the point where HVRHS became known for that sport and he was later inducted into the Connecticut Coaches Hall of Fame. As Principal of the high school for thirteen years, he helped the school to modernize and grow and he continued to serve on state athletic committees as President of the Northwest Conference. He team-taught a geology class while Principal to maintain active in the classroom. For the past five years, he has been a very active Assistant Superintendent of this region, initiating a refinement of teaching skills program for the faculty which has since grown into a "teacher-coach" system which is nationally known. It is fitting that he was our graduation speaker this year, ending his HVRHS affiliation as we ended ours. His interests are many, his energy unlimited, his commitment to education unceasing — 1985 is merely the beginning of his next project. Good luck, Mr. Kirby, and thank you.
