Begining the year with five returning lettermen and four other experienced seniors, the 1977-78 basketball season promised to be an exciting one for Housatonic. The pre-season optimism was born out. This year the Mountaineers won more games (16) than any other team in the 39 year history of the school. Prior to 1978, the Mountaineers best record occurred just after World War II when the $1945-46$ team with John O’Hara, Milton Clay, Jack Dudley. Ross Grannan and Bob Baldwin won 14 and lost 2.
During the Christmas break the Mountaineers won their first Varsity Tournament ever, defeating Lee, Massachusetts 68 to 42 and Monument Mountain, Massachusetts 64 to 55 to bring home the Championship trophy. For their play in the tournament junior Bob Sieller and sophomore Gib Lassen were elected to the All-Tournament team.
The Mountaineers reeled off eight straight victories to begin their year, including wins over Canton (59-54) and Mills (82-62), before losing to Litchfield $(66-83)$ at Housatonic on January 11. Then it snowed. With postponements wreaking havoc to the schedule the team played when it could, including one stretch of seven games in 13 days.
Winning four of its five games during the second half of the season the Mountaineers headed into the final weeks of the season with a 12 and 3 record. For the first time in many years HVRHS beat Gilbert (77-59) then notched a win against Wolcott Tech ( $62-50$ ). The second Canton game saw Bill Segalla give the best individual player performance of the year scoring 30 points on 14 field goals and two foul shots to lead the HVRHS win.
The Mountaineers ended their regular season with 15 wins and 5 losses. Going into post season play Housatonic was ranked 9 th of the 33 teams in the Class S C.I.A.C. Basketball Tournament and 3rd in Region 2 for the tournament playdowns.
But before the tournament began the Mountaineers, because of their second place finish in the Northwest Conference, Division 2, drew Middletown High School of the large school division for the conference playoff. The Mountaineers became Middletown's 71 st straight win. Led by tri-captains Mike Lamb, Jim Johnson and Billy Segalla, Housatonic opened the C.I.A.C. State Tournament against Shepaug High School. Winning 50 to 45 it was the first State Tournament victory in the Mountaineers' 30 year history. The year saw many personal achievements for the Mountaineers. Mike Lamb capped his senior year by becoming the first Housatonic player to score over 1000 points. Mike finished his career with a total of 1115 points smashing the career record of Bob Stoddard of 782 points set in the years 1971-1974. Other records set by Mike include: most field goals in a season (177); Most field goals in a career (449); most rebounds in a career (890); breaking the record of 536 set by Hoot Belter between 1966 and 1968; best shooting percentage for a career ( $51 \%$ ); best shooting percentage for a season ( $54 \%$ ); most free throws in a career (217) and finally Mike had the best scoring average for his career of any other Mountaineer (17.9), breaking the record of 17.1 points per game set by Gary Bergenty set between 1967-1969.

Clayton Paniati, the team's 6 foot 7 inch sixth man, established himself as the Mountaineer's top shot blocker with 51 rejects this season to eclipse the record of 35 set by Jim Belter in 1972. On a team basis Housatonic averaged 67.95 points per game to set a new season scoring record of 1495 points breaking last years record by 101 points.
The Mountaineers held their opponents to 59.13 points per game to attain an average margin of victory of 8.82 points.
The final judgement of the teams success or failure depends on innumerable events which occur during any year: injuries, weather, flu, and personalities, to mention a few. But in the final judgement, it is the players who through their effort and dedication enjoy the final success. The squad had three girls recognized by the Northwest Conference coaches. Becky Carlson was selected to the first conference team and Susan Chilcoat and Kim Miles were selected to the second team.

Becky Carlson was this year's Most Valuable Player and Susan Chilcoat was selected as this year's Most Improved Player.
The team will be losing four Seniors this year. Four-year center and tri-captain Becky Carlson, four year guard and tri-captain Lynn Kelsey, tri-captain Nancy Van Doren and forward Janet Schneider. Nice job girls for a fine season!

JUNIOR VARSITY: The 1977-78 Junior Varsity Girls Baske ball team had its best year ever with a $15-0$ season, summing up $21-0$ string from last year. The team averaged 46 points per game and allowed 16 points per game. Litchfield and Mount Evere were the only teams to give the JV's strong competition durin the season. This years starting five were all Sophomores, in cluding Captain Carole Alto, who was the teams leading score and second in rebounding; Denise McDonald, a transfer wa second in scoring and the best outside shot; Whitney Perkins le the team in rebounding and assists; Ellen Carlson, a swing guar was a good outside shot and defensive player; Jennifer Trott was the point guard and did very well running the team. Thi years team had depth, the girls coming off the bench did a supe job.
