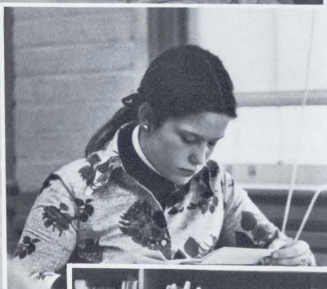
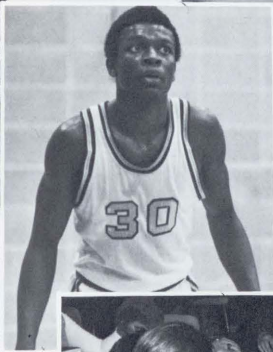




NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY

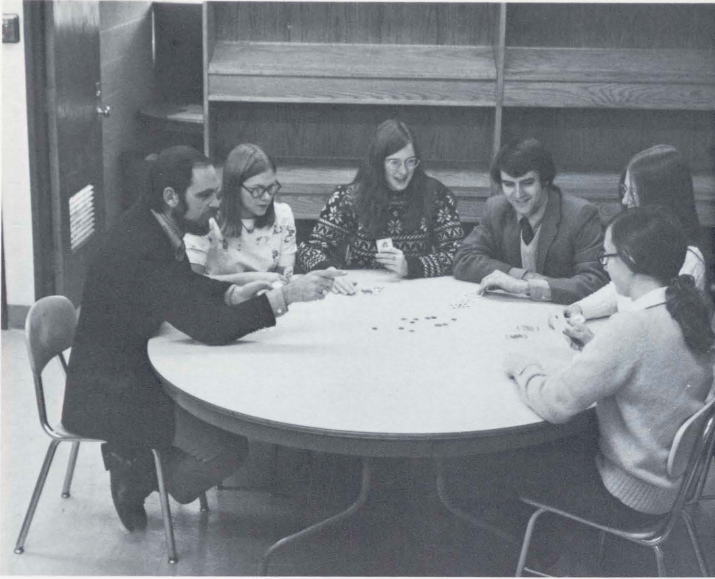

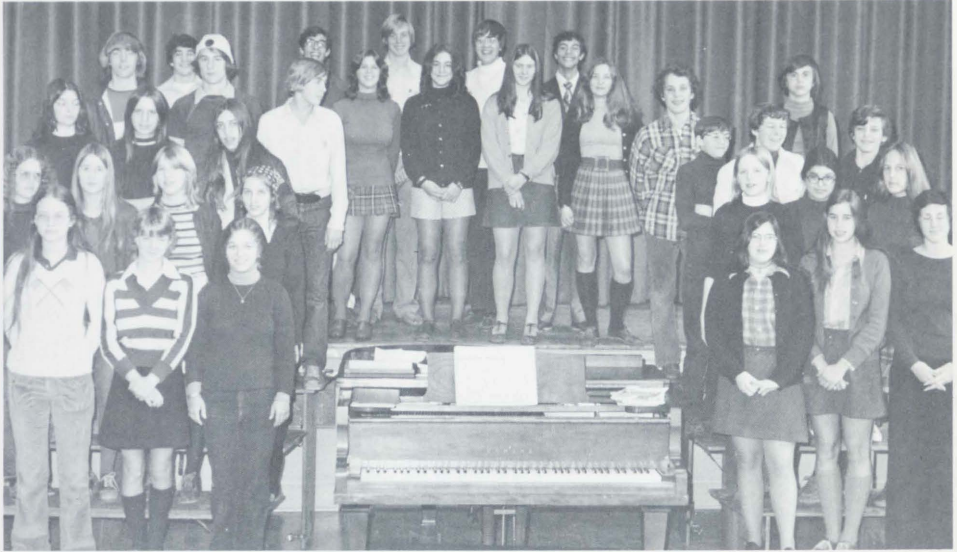

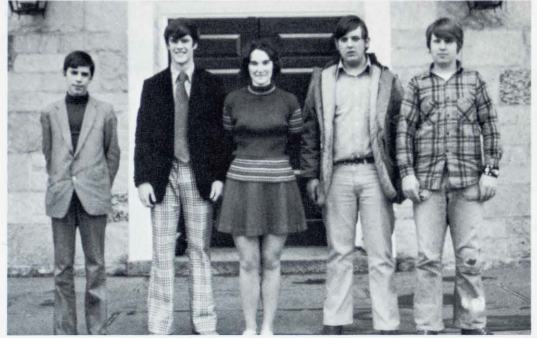

I want to stress the importance of my American family (Curtiss) and the way they accepted me and I had the opportunity to understand to express myself without inhibition.

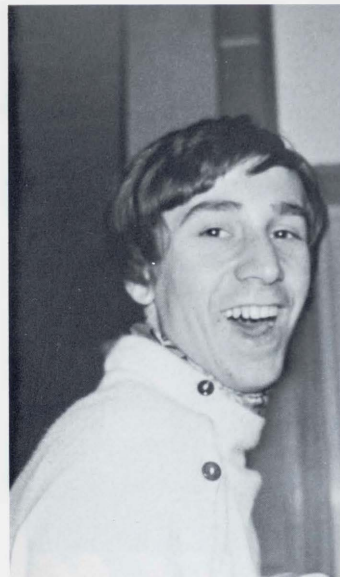
I feel particularly indebted to everyone in Housatonic Valley Regional High School who gave me the opportunity to understand that I'm able to love and to be loved.
