ixteen Housatonic Valley Regional High School students ranging from sophomores through seniors lived with host families for over two weeks in Hamburg, Germany. Organized by German teacher Kimberly Durley, students were provided an opportunity to be immersed in Germany's culture and to practice their language skills. Students enjoyed German foods, soccer, television, film, public transportation, candy, and went to school with their host siblings each week. Beyond the homes and classrooms, students went on daily excursions to local towns such as Lübeck - a UNESCO World Heritage Site, Travemunde - a small seaside town on the Baltic, and the concentration camp Neuengamme. The highlight of the trip was the overnight to the capital city of Berlin. Students visited the main tourist attractions including the Reichstag - the capitol building and the East Side Gallery - an original section of the Berlin wall that still stands today as a monument. Our tour guide also took us to some attractions off the beaten past like the artist commune of Tacheles. At the farewell meeting on the last day of school, students were outfitted with Kaiser-Friedrich-Ufer t-shirts and the assistant principal of KaiFU welcomed HVRHS students and faculty back to visit in years to come, dubbing HVRHS the sister school of KaiFU. This year's freshmen and sophomore German students look forward to hosting German students in the fall of 2013 as well as traveling to and living in Germany in 2014.



FRENCH STUDENTS RANK NATIONALLY IN CONTEST

Xavier Quintilla, Sebastien Lasseur, and Kelsey Seitz ranked nationally in the 77th annual *Le Grand Concours* competition sponsored by the American Association of Teachers of French. Students were evaluated for their written, oral and listening comprehension skills. 97,353 students in all 50 states competed in the 2012 event. Xavier (11th grade) ranked 4th in the state of Connecticut and 8th nationally for French Level 5. Sebastien (12th grade) ranked 5th in the state and 9th nationally for French Level 5. Kelsey (12th grade) ranked 10th in the state and 11th nationally for French Level 1. In addition, the following students received the *Certificat d'Honneur* for scoring in the top 20th percentile nationally: **Level 1**: M. Cleary, M. Riley, K. Seitz, **Level 2**: C. Ocain, **Level 5**: S. Lasseur, X. Quintilla.



Perhaps the strongest showing of the competion came from the Sweethearts, who scored a 91/100, Superior Rating, taking first place. Cassy Worthington took Best Vocal Soloist the entire festival.
