All of the classes put forth a great effort and the Juniors deservedly won the contest. It was a week of great fun for all.





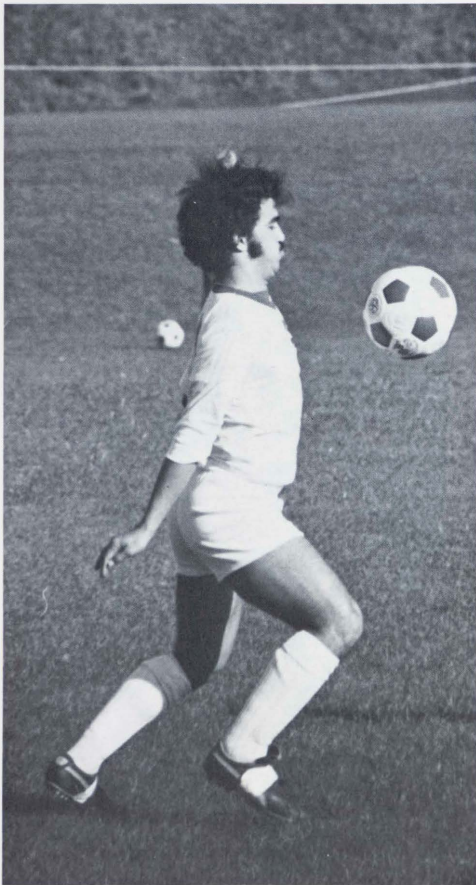

Once again the annual Student Council Tea was a big success. All who attended benefitted much from it.





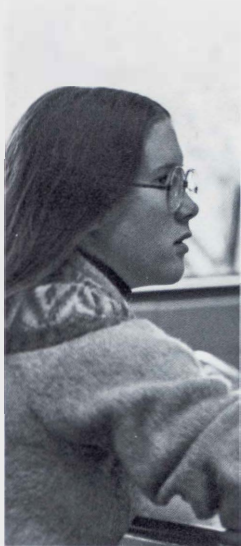

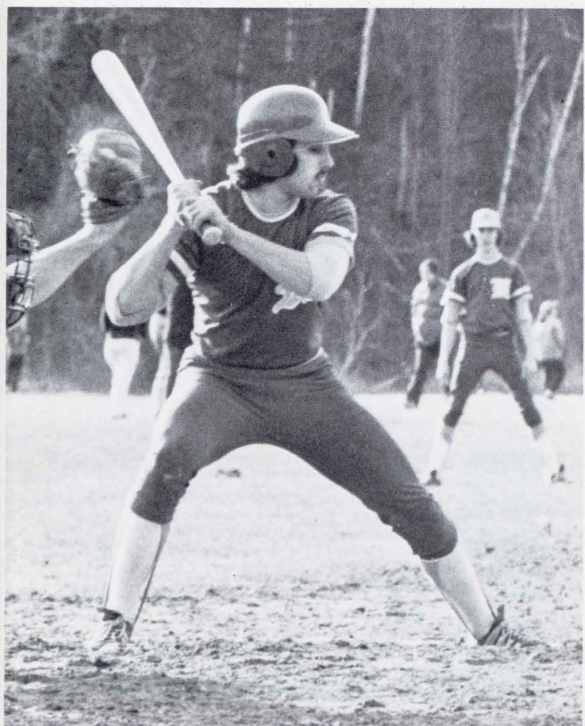
BASEBALL

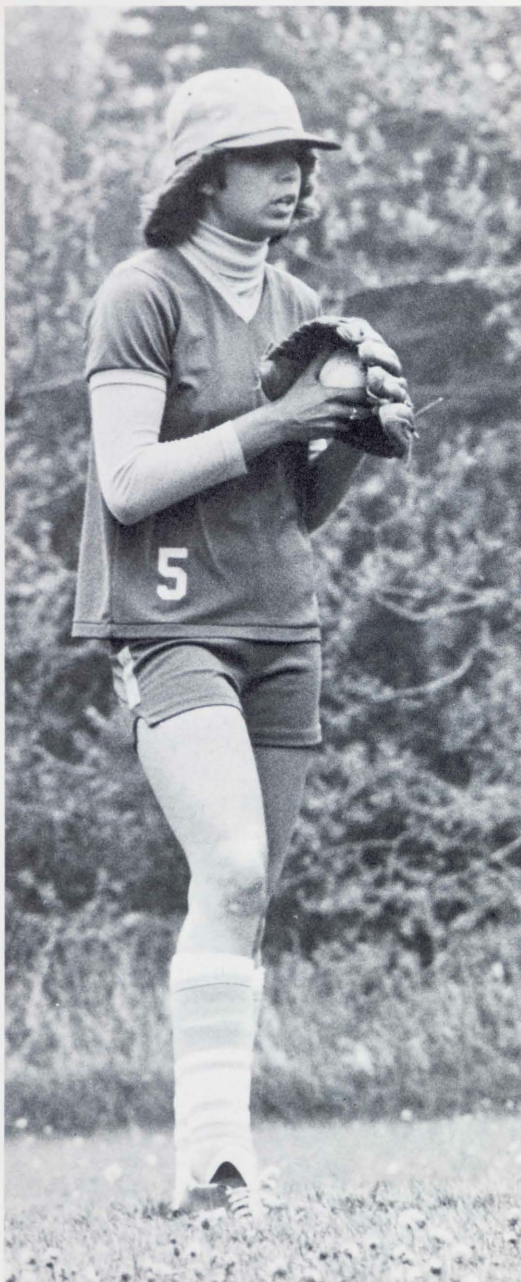

This area was a concern at the season's end, a statistic which speaks for itself. Two Housatonic juniors, Terry Carberry and Terry Kearns, were selected to the Berkshire League All-Star First Team. In addition to those people mentioned above, Barbara Baird and Laurie Hall, both juniors, and Connie Tobin, a sophomore, contributed to the success of the team this season. The team's Most Valuable Player award went to Ellen Carlson and Evan Lyle received the Most Improved Player award.

Numerous factors determine a successful season. Hard work and sacrifice are two important ingredients which readily come to mind. Significant too are the willing cooperation and knowledgeable support provided a coach by his immediate superior, assistant, and student manager. Therefore my sincere thanks go to Ed Tyburski, Judy Wright, and Margaret Burgess. In a special way I thank the parents for their support, both visibly and behind the scenes. Their concern and understanding over the course of a season are certainly appreciated.
