



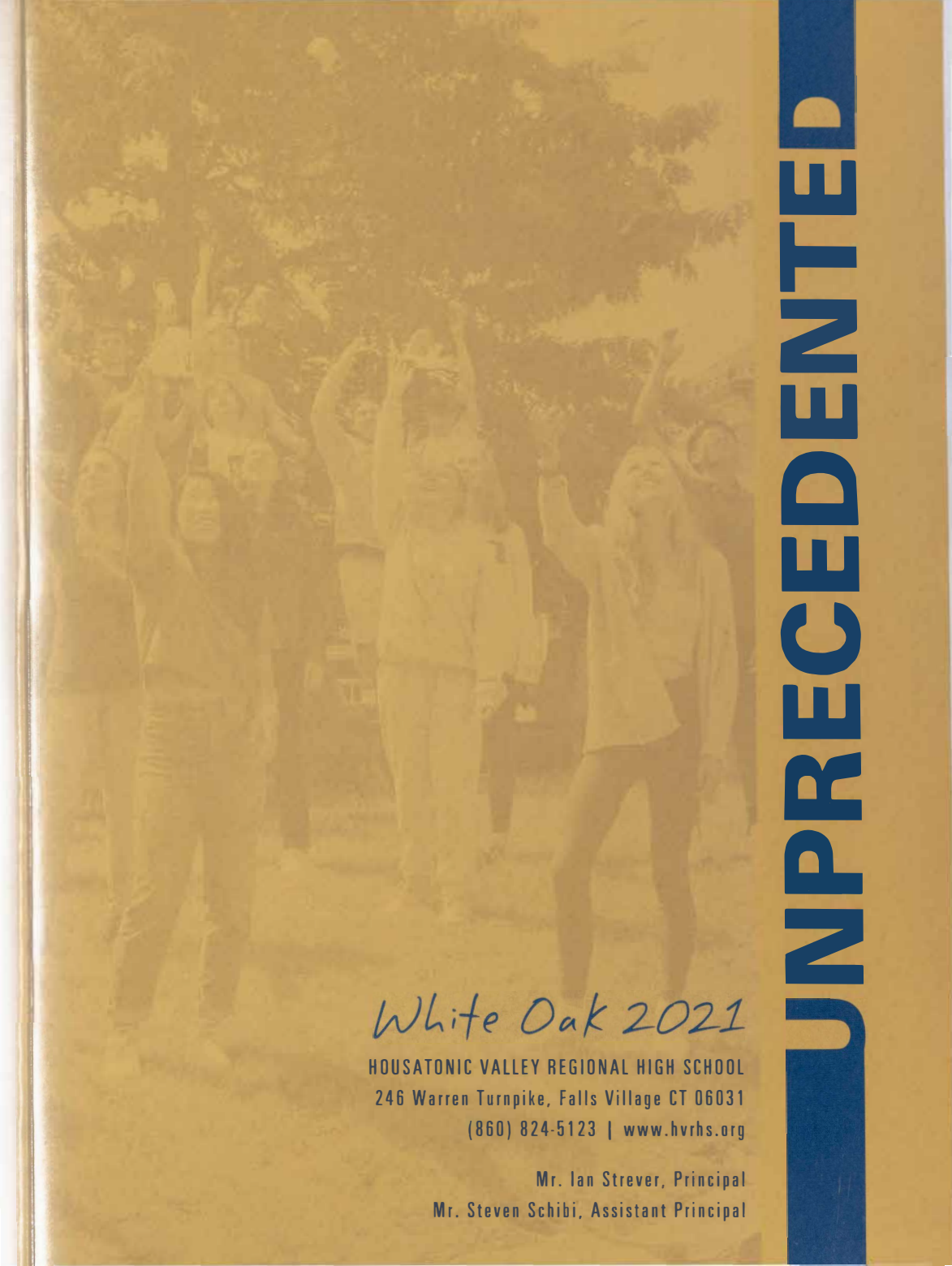

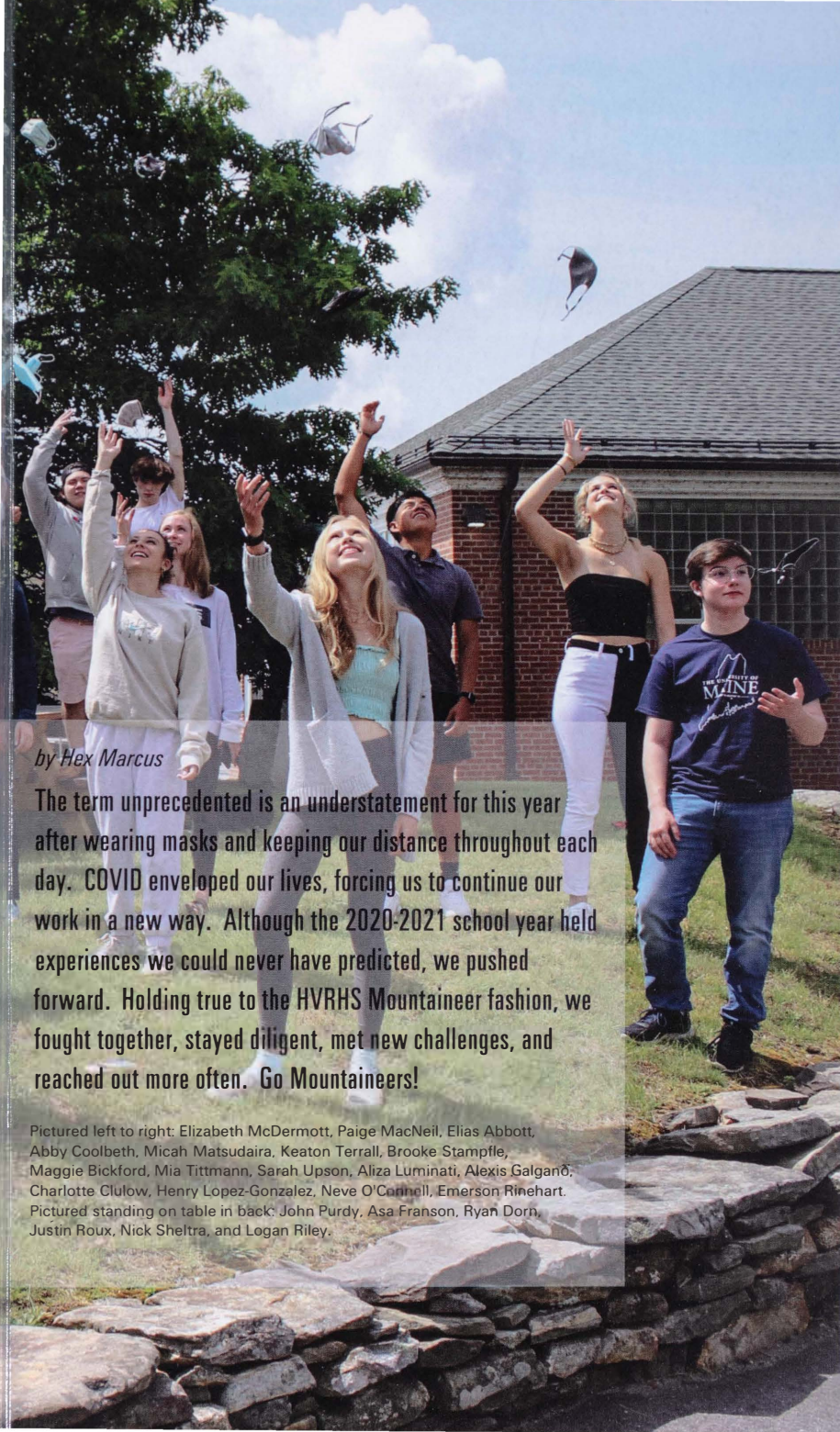

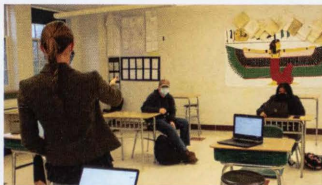


REACHING STUDENTS AT HOME

21st Century Fund supports STEM learning at home during the pandemic. These STEM kits allowed students to experience hands-on lab work at home.

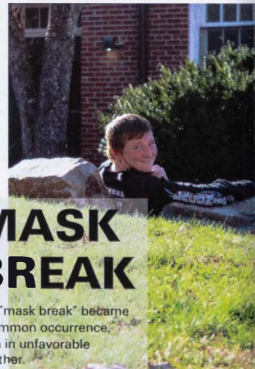


TINY CLASSES

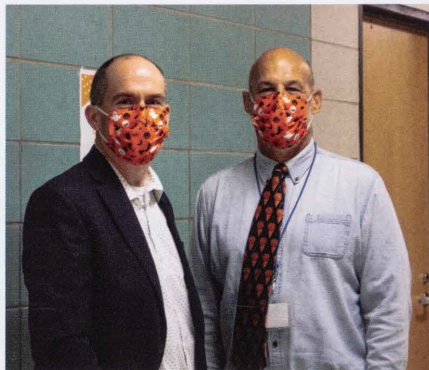

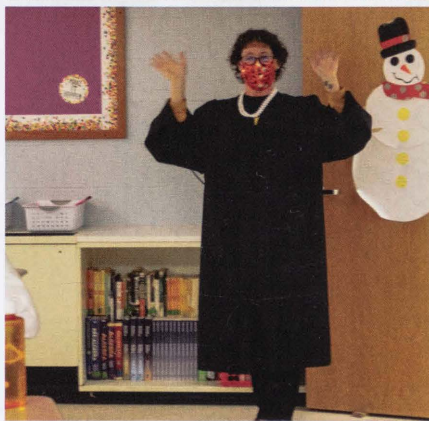


CHANNELING RGB

Foreign Exchange students Zoe Kaiser from Zurich, Switzerland, Francesca Tintori from Bergamo, Italy, and Lou Jacquet from Saint Avertin, France discuss their home schools.

Zoe: "The teachers are really nice here and in Switzerland they're more strict and serious. But we need to find a balance between the system here and the system in Switzerland. Here it's too easy and in Switzerland it's too high pressure and stressful." **Lou:** "I think school here is better than school in France just because of the teachers. Teachers are friendly and helpful. That is something I am going to miss back in France." **Francesca:** "Housy is so different from my Italian school. I have the same 25 classmates for all my high school years and I do not have the option to choose my classes. We also have no sports or after-school activities. Here students receive sports scholarships to go to college while in my country colleges are interested in skills such as collaboration, organization, leadership and teamwork."

What surprised you? What will you miss?

"Even with Covid everyone was incredibly welcoming and I felt comfortable in school. It was great that we were still able to do extracurricular activities! I'll miss late openings and early dismissals."

The Academic Bowl team made it all the way to the National Academic Championship.

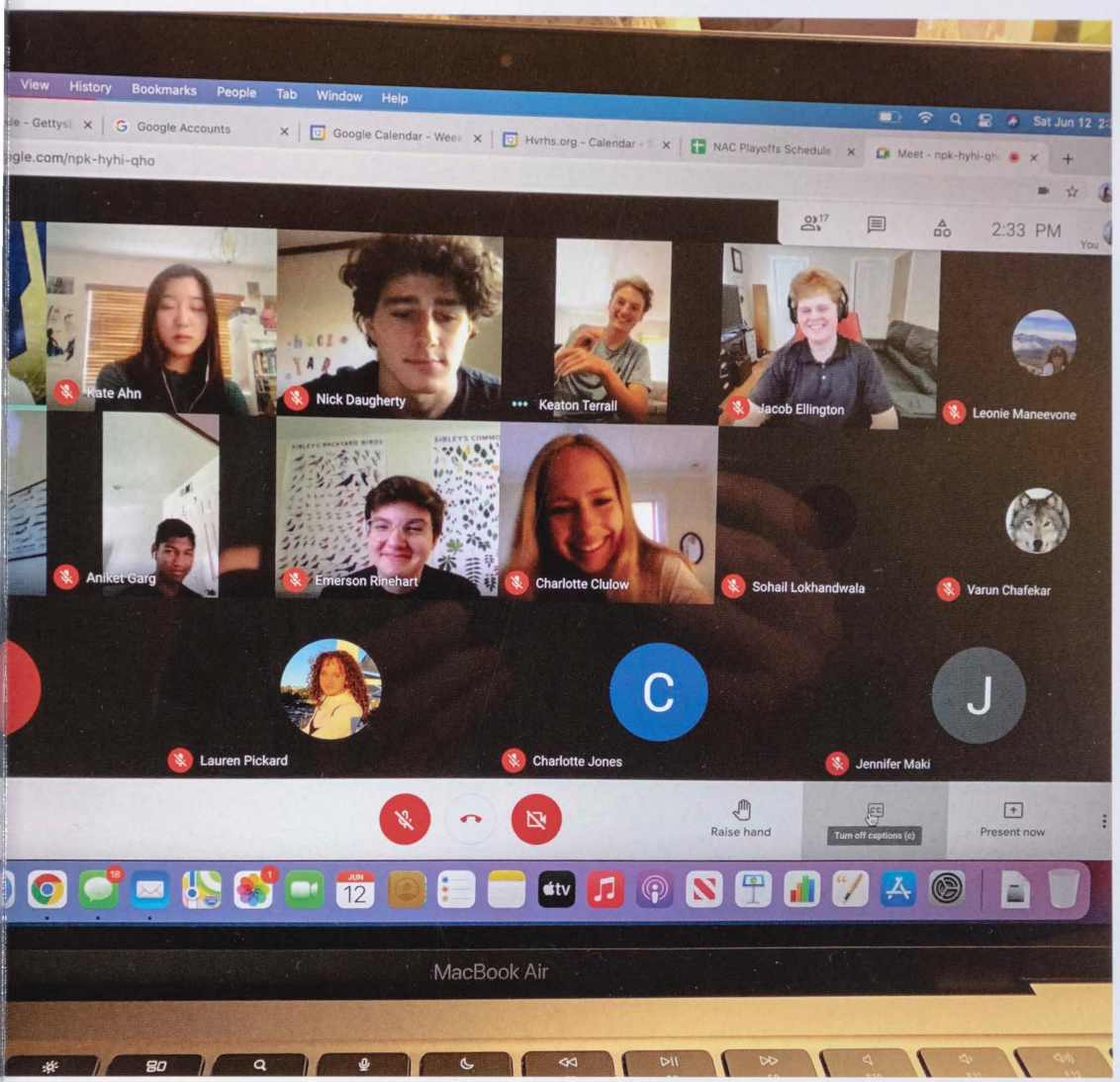

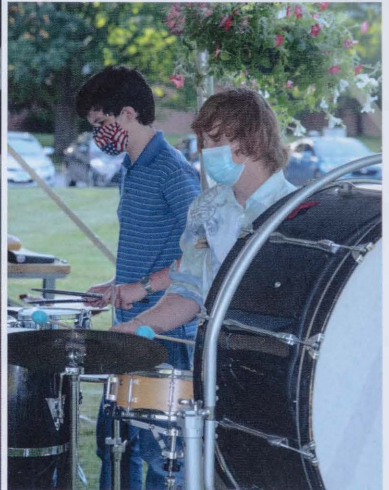

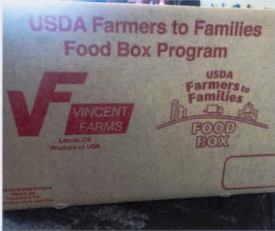

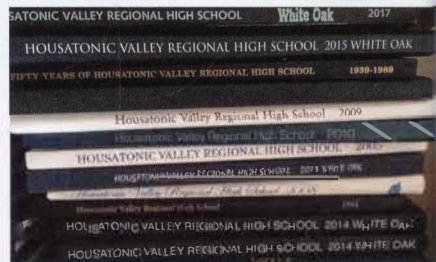
The smallest yearbook staff in recent years pulled together small features and an inclusive photographic representation of our year and student body.

The storm held out long enough for some sun and plenty of fun for an early picnic during senior week at The Grove in Salisbury.



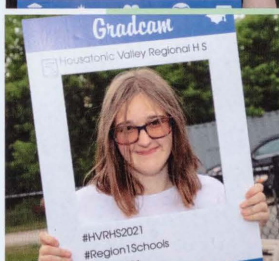

DID IT!

White Oak 2021, Volume 80 was produced by the yearbook club at Housatonic Valley Regional School in Falls Village, Connecticut. The book was printed by Herff Jones, Inc. in Edwardsville, Kansas. The account was serviced by representative Sonja Henke and customer service advisor Jill Camburako. The yearbook advisor was Rosanne Costa. The theme for the yearbook is Unprecedented. The visual theme - including the cover, endsheets, opening, and divider pages - was designed by HJ artist Marie Brink, Rosanne Costa, and Sonja Henke. The cover incorporated a four-color lithograph printed on white permocote base material with matte UV coating. Endsheets were printed in full-color process on VC-01 white material.

The yearbook club of four students built the 144-page book, and all 133 printed copies of the book were purchased by students and staff members. The pages were printed on 100# bordeaux paper stock. Body copy was in 9 pt. AHJ Urbano. Captions were in 7 pt. AHJ Urbano. The headline font was in 72 pt. AHJ Urbano Black and accented by font in 50 pt. AHJ Handschrift Print. Subtitles were written in 18 pt. AHJ Urbano Extra Condensed font. All caption headings were in 12 pt. AHJ Urbano Extra Condensed. Quotes not within body copy were written in 8 pt. AHJ Urbano Light Condensed Italic.

Unprecedented was produced using eDesign on a Dell computer and several student chrome books. Photographs were taken using a Canon Rebel XTi digital camera, student and parent submissions, and the yearbook staff's personal digital cameras. Professional portraits, team action photographs, and event photographs were taken by Life Touch of Cranston, Rhode Island, and yearbook staff members.

White Oak is a member of the Columbia Scholastic Press Association, from which the books from the last two years earned a silver medal. The staff's work on yearbook theme and cover design for 2019 and 2020 was also recognized and showcased by Herff Jones in their best-of publication, "Portfolio."
