Many Problems Concern Student Council

Serving as a medium of communication between the faculty and the students, the Student Council is composed of twenty members: eight seniors, six juniors, four sophomores, and two freshmen. The foreign exchange student is an honorary member, and Mr. Edward Dorsett is adviser to the group.

Activities of the Student Council include the annual Spaghetti Supper, a biennial Spring Carnival, and the Student Council Assembly. The main topics of discussion at the assembly this year grew out of problems related to the new addition. Because of the construction of the new building, for instance, the smoking area had been eliminated the year before. The Regional Board then abolished the smoking area permanently, with the Student Council taking an active part in a campaign to discourage smoking by high school students.

Each year the Student Council prepares a Telephone Directory, a Student Handbook, and football programs. The 1962-1963 Student Handbook was completely reorganized to make room for the addition of new clubs and other information about new facilities of the school.

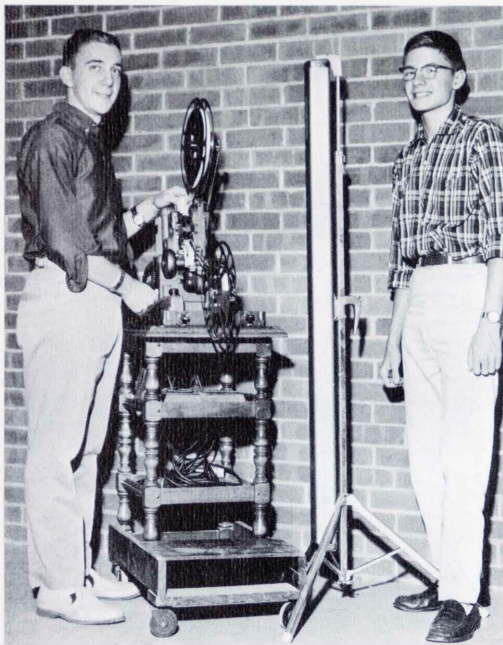

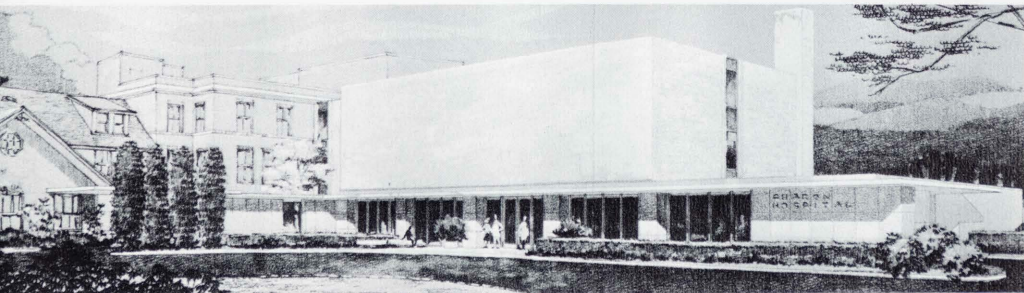
Teen-aides, organized in 1956, sends its members each evening to the Sharon Hospital where they help the nurses by serving fruit juices and doing various errands for patients.

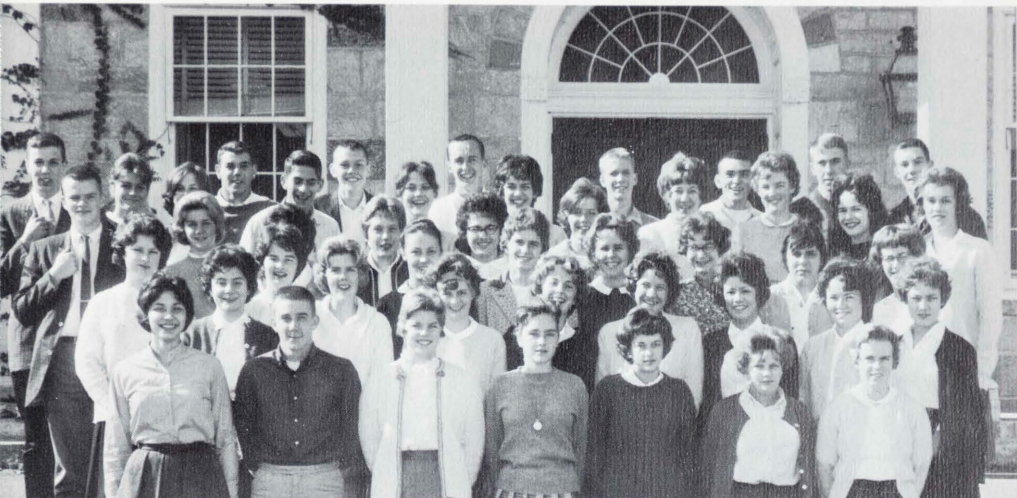

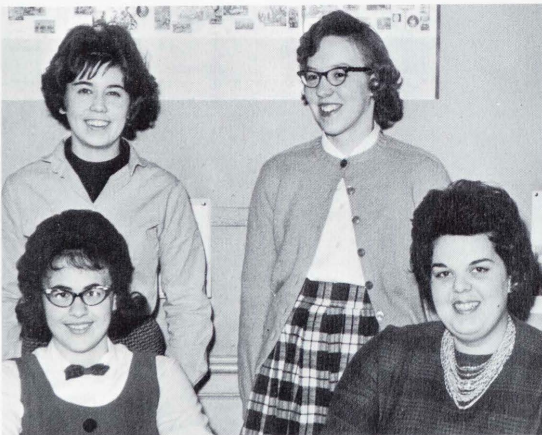

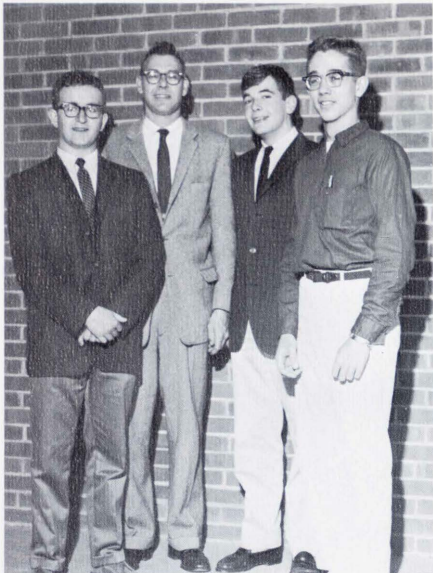

Although Challenge is not specifically a debating organization, meetings have never been lacking in heated discussion of major political and sociological issues.

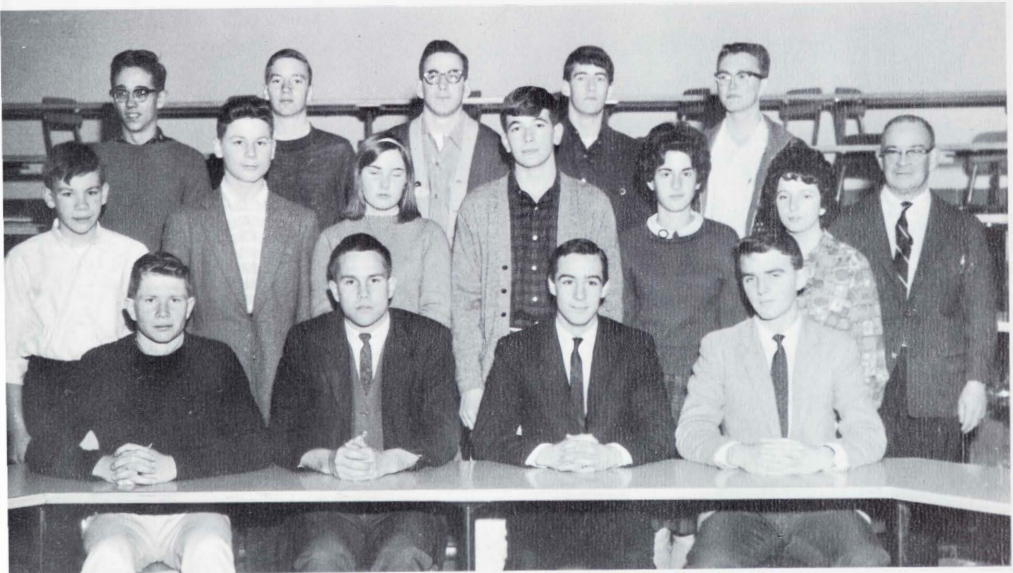

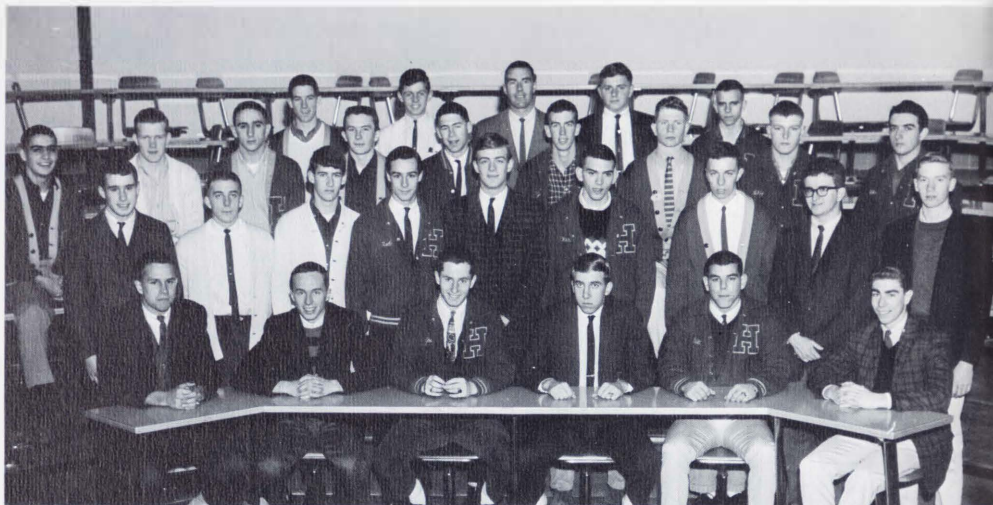

The inter-town basketball tournament was revived this year, with pupils from all grammar schools in the Regional District participating.

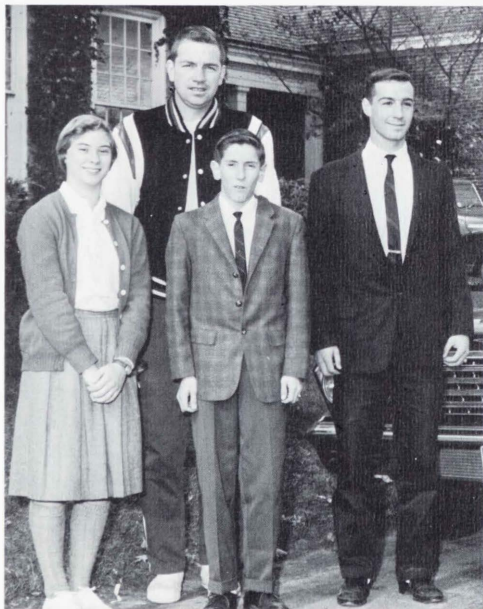
The main objective of the Varsity Club is to promote good sportsmanship and to encourage wider student participation in sports at Regional.
