## AMERICAN FIELD SERVICE



This past summer we had Ben Freund and Sheree Jackson go abroad for American Field Service. Ben went to Turkey and Sheree went to Costa Rica.

Sheree had this to say about her trip: "Costa Rica is about the size of Connecticut. I lived in the city of Nicoya, where it is the hottest part of the country, and is also the cattle raising area of Costa Rica."
Her "family" consisted of a mother, father, five brothers and two sisters. Her mother cooked on a wood stove out in back of the house. The house itself had five bedrooms, one bathroom, and a large room divided into a kitchen and dining room.
While she was there, Sheree attended school and met many friends. She hated to leave these friends whom she had come to like a lot - and who, in return, hated to see her go, and told her that she was a Costa Rican no matter what anyone said.



Ben had this to say about Turkey: "Turkey is East and West, old and new, cold and hot, history and geography. I could walk along a street and on one side find a 16th Century house, and on the other side find a 21st Century discotheque. People in Turkey are conservative, people are open-minded, people are religious, people aren't so religious, people are formal, people are casual and countless other contrasts. The father in the Turkish family is most respected. The family itself is a close, warm, and very meaningful object in the Turkish life, even though a 'generation gap' exists very clearly between the parents and the kids."
"Turkish food is very good - it's one of the ways that people show their hospitality. The fashions where I lived were extremely modern as compared to some of the smaller towns where they still wear the veil and keep a few illegal harems."

It was a fantastic experience for Ben, but only a small beginning to intercultural understanding for him.


## CARLOS GOMEZ

We have a cute little Latin American student with us this year. Carlos comes from San Jose, Costa Rica, is staying with Steve Tietjen, and says, "I like the people here. I am very happy." Carlos finds very few differences in his way of life from that of the United States. He says that the schools here are much more lenient, but in Costa Rica, life outside of school is very relaxed.
Carlos was on the soccer team and likes living in America and the American way of life, but his dedication is to representing Costa Rica through AFS.

## NORIKO GOTO

Of our three AFS'ers this year, we have one girl who comes to us from Japan. Noriko is from Shizuoka, a city of about 450,000 on the main island. She finds life a little slower and quite diferent here in America, but says that she really loves the trees and hills. Norika, who loves to try everything (especially food), was a little sad because she found out that there wouldn't be a Girls' Basketball team this year, but has made up for missing her favorite sport by proving herself exceptional in two sports she's never played before - soccer and softball.

Noriko is staying with Denise Bergenty and in her spare time likes to cook for the family because the opportunity wasn't offered to her back home in Japan.

Of the wins this season, the most satisfying was Belter's shutout of Lewis Mills. He was backed up by enough hitting to establish a $7-0$ score. The $3-1$ loss to Farmington was also an excellent game. The slugfest at Berlin, even though a loss, was a crowd-pleaser because of the constant runs scored throughout the game, ending in a 17 to 11 score.

Centered around Foley, team-leading hitter Don Smith, reliable Tim Riley, and promising newcomers Mike Cahill and Jack Baird, the team should move up in the standings next year. Veterans Steve Belter and Mike Joachim should provide the experience needed next spring.

Joe Miller scored a lot of points in his several specialties, but the surprise of the season was Bob Beverly's sprinting ability - he and steady Larry Tyler will be the Field Captains next spring. Undisputed top miler in the conference, Perry Gasperini was also selected as team MVP, and led the NWC All-Star ranks with undefeated half-miler, Gary Davis, Tom Warner in the quarter, and next year's Track Captain, distance runner Randy Chapell.
These Tri-captains, several juniors, and some very competitive and talented underclassmen give the team something to look forward to in the near future.
