#### Abstract

Shakespeare is the theme of the 1965 WHITE OAK. We thought it fitting to commemorate Shakespeare because the school year marked the four hundredth anniversary of his birth. Throughout the book are quotations from his plays and sonnets which seemed to us to be appropriate. Although the words were written long ago, their meanings are often as much to the point today as they were in the sixteenth and seventeenth centuries when Shakespeare wrote them. Of course, Shakespeare did not foresee our particular activities, but he understood the spirit of athletes, whether it was that of the jousting champions in "Merrie England" or that of baseball pitchers at Regional today. We found some captions humorous, others serious, but we hope that they blend together to form a meaningful yearbook that records the year at Regional in our pictures but in Shakespeare's words.
