It is difficult for me to believe that there was a time when I did not know what the initials AFS stood for and associated nothing with Sweden except the words *smorgasbord* and *socialism*.

Now after a summer in Sweden under the auspices of the American Field Service, I have become a part of another country and another people. For two months I lived in a small farming village 75 miles below the Arctic Circle and nearly twenty-four hours under the Midnight Sun. The heart of this desolate village was the Erssons, my adopted Swedish family. Their generosity knew no bounds as I became a member of a family which already included eleven people, seven cows, two pigs, and a dog. During the early weeks my use of Swedish seemed to be limited to eating and smiling in that language. As I worked in the fields, helped feed the pig, and tried every conceivable combination of Swedish pancakes and pastries, I felt the true value of an international exchange student program such as AFS. Because of the program I not only have another family in a country foreign to my own, but I have been able to see the world, its virtues and faults, through eyes other than those of an American. American Field Service is certainly one of the important answers to some of the problems of this turbulent world.

My AFS summer is something which I treasure more each day, and I feel more than grateful to all of those both in Sweden and in America who made my journey possible.

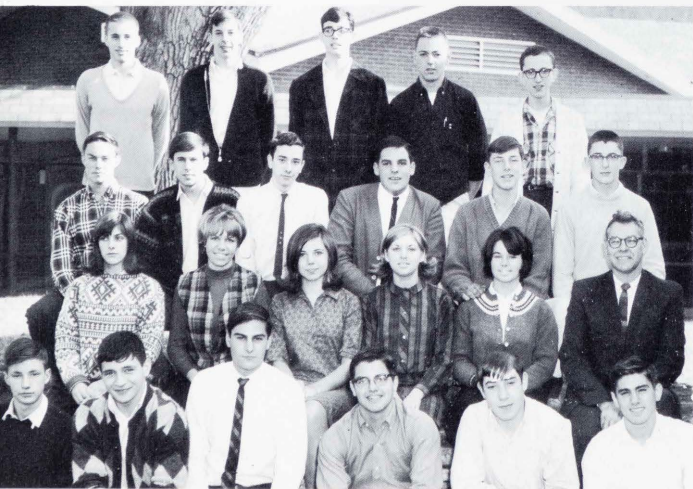
CHALLENGE CLUB

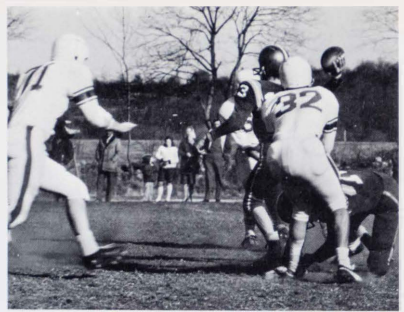

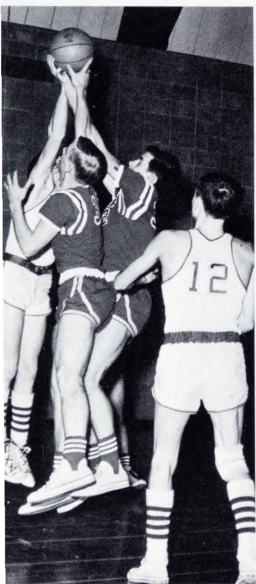

The class of 1965's Junior Assembly in 1964 was focused on the theme "Disunity." Many of the skits were original take-offs of various aspects of school life.

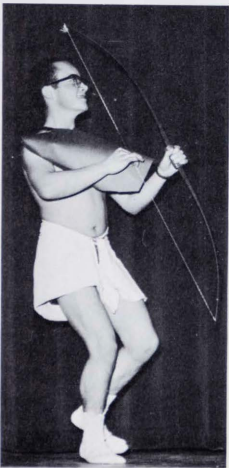
