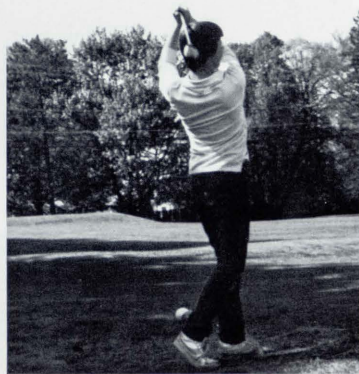
GOLF

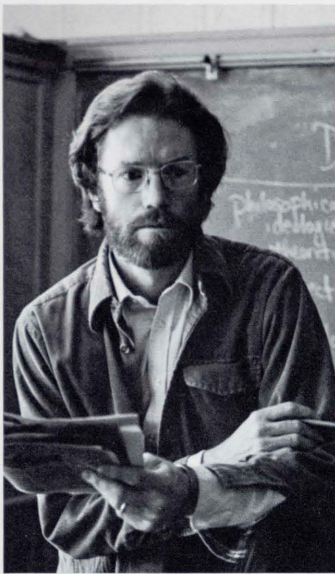
ALTERNATIVE PROGRAMS

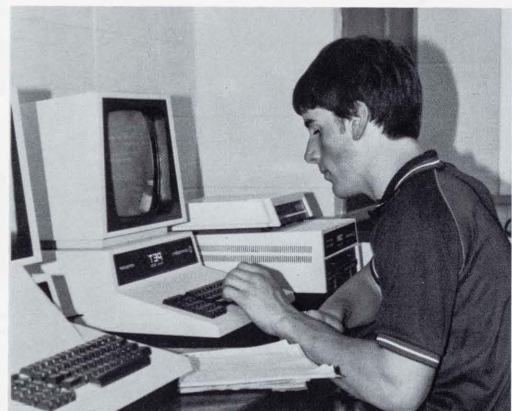
The BOOKSTORE sells needed but additional items for classes in the morning before regularly scheduled classes begin.

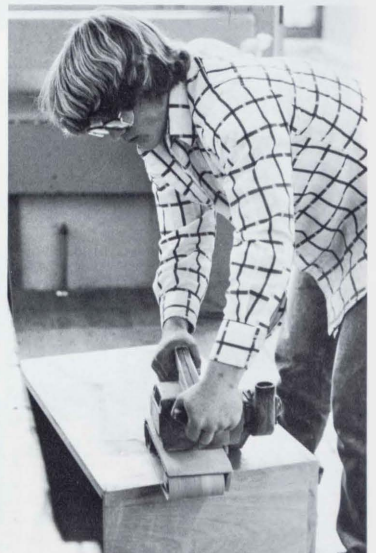


FRENCH CLUB:

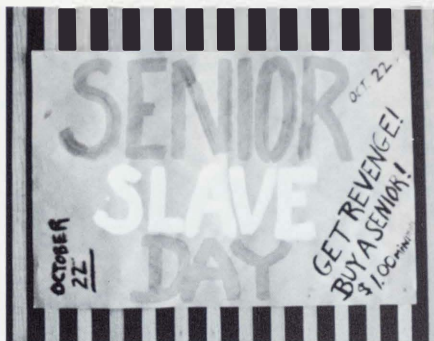




SPIRIT WEEK
