TENNIS COURTS: TO BE OR NOT TO BE?

he good news is that already on hand in a Tennis Courts Fund is about \$24,000, and some good folks locally have indicated willingness to make in-kind contributions to bring down the cost of the project, expected to be in the vicinity of \$110,000. The bad news is that so far we alumni have come up with only \$3,600 in donations. We thank those of you who have responded. and we appeal to those of you who have not. A site has been chosen (the property along Warren Turnpike north of where the little red barn stood), over \$27,000 has been collected through the years, volunteers stand ready to pitch in, some of the best young tennis players in the Berkshire League are looking to us. and we have reason to honor the Sixtieth Anniversary of a wonderful school, the first of its kind east of the Hudson River. Most public high schools do not even have active alumni associations let alone one that can accomplish something as special as we have set out to do. So please "answer the challenge with all that's best in you."

Here is the nitty gritty: we are trying to pay for the newsletters out of the dues you send us. That money goes into a checking account from which we draw to pay for paper, ink cartridges, and postage. The printing is done at the school by the students of the Mountaineer Press. Your tax deductible donations go into the HVRHS Alumni Fund at the Berkshire Taconic Community Foundation where they are invested and earn us a return. So the more we collect in dues, the less likely we are to have to invade our invested funds to

send you the newsletters. If things go according to plan, this will be the first issue of <u>Blue</u> 'n' <u>Gold</u> paid for entirely out of dues.

How It Works

hen you wish to be in touch with members of your class, or with our Association, use your class agent as your point of contact. Check the list to the left on this page and FIND A WAY TO PRESERVE THE INFORMATION. Some suggestions: (1) attach the list to your refrigerator; (2) transfer the information on your agent to your address book; (3) preserve it in your electric organizer; (4) like a good secret agent, memorize it and swallow it

Here are some of the items that your class agent expects to receive from you: any news you wish to pass along in the newsletter; requests for information about upcoming reunions; and, especially, notifications of change of address.
