The 1980-81 Housatonic Girl's Varsity Basketball Team finished with a disappointing 2-16 record. However, with only one graduating senior and nine returning letter winners (including six sophomores), the outlook for next year and the future seasons are bright.

The team was keyed by sophomore Jennifer Riley, who was named as the team's Most Valuable Player. She led the team in scoring with 158 points, an average of 8.8 points per game, and rebounding with 125, an average of 6.9 a game. In addition, she was named a second-team Berkshire League All Star.

The team was also paced by sophomore Erika Sternlof and junior Candi Carlson. Sternlof was second on the squad in both points and rebounds. Carlson contributed 80 points despite missing some action due to illness. Also, senior captain, Chris Kelsey filled in leadership on a sophomore-dominated team. The remainder of the team included juniors: Candy Perotti and Kim Lachler; and sophomores: Joanne Fick, Maria Johnson, Hilda Miller, and Nora Stevens.

This year was one of new and more challenging pastimes, one of which the most popular was backgammon. Although this picture only reveals the originators, the club has grown tremendously. Once again the Class of 1981 has left its mark of intellect.

Each year the Chess Club makes two or three trips to area tournaments. In November 1980, Robert Johnson played in the Albany open, at the Metropolitan Psychiatric Hospital in Albany, New York. This was a two-day event, 5-round Swiss System, 50 moves in 2 hours, by the clock. Robert won 2 games, lost 2 games, and drew 1, raising his USCF rating from 1050 to 1232. Last year's rotating victory trophy, now held by Housatonic, will be defended at a pair of matches with the Gunnery School in Washington, Connecticut, in the spring of 1981. We trust it will be in the Main Office next fall.

FOOTBALL

The Housatonic varsity football team enjoyed a modestly successful season in 1980, finishing with a 3-5 record. The Mountaineers, however, in voting by the Bi-Valley league coaches at the end of the season, placed three players on the All-League team, with one of them voted the top player in the league at his position.

Housatonic was led by senior co-captains, Scott Palmer and John Ongley. Ongley surprised no one by leading Housatonic in rushing with 574 yards in 100 carries; almost 6 yards a carry. In addition, he led the team in scoring with 38 points, and was second in receiving yardage and tackles. John was named to the Bi-Valley League All-Star team as a running back of the 1980 season. Palmer, the heart of the Mountaineer offensive and defensive lines, was named to the Bi-Valley League All-Star team at left offensive guard, and finished third on the team in tackles with 26, and 18 assists.

Junior, Ed Pequignot was the third member named to the Bi-Valley All-Star team, at safety. He led the team in interceptions with 6, and was second to Ongley in rushing with 501 yards, at an average of 6.6 per carry.

There were many other key players: Richard Mugler, a tough running back and middle guard, who led the team with 57 tackles and 25 assists (over 10 a game), and still found the time to rush for 385 yards. Joe Chase led the team in pass receiving with a 20 yard catch average. Quarterback, Dan Smith, ran the team with aplomb. Senior Robert Johnson, and junior Todd Vernali, both out for the team for the first time, added stability to a young interior line corps. Chase, Smith, and Muhler and Johnson were among those accorded Bi-Valley League Honorable Mention status.

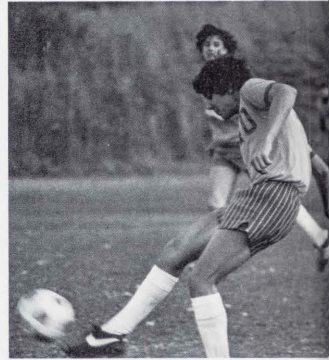
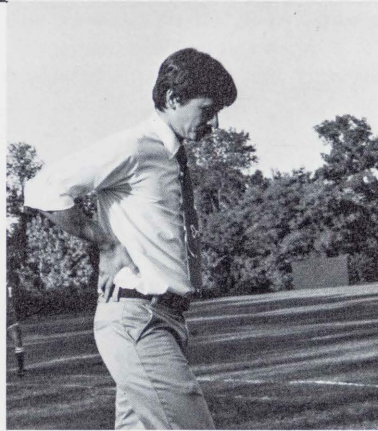
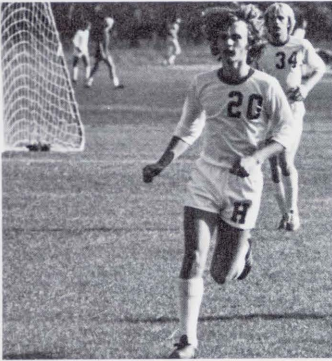
The 1980 Housatonic girls' soccer team enjoyed a strong season, finishing 6-5-1, capped by a 3-0 victory over Hamden in the state tournament.

They were led by tri-captains, Terry Carberry, Terry Kearns, and Donna Pequignot. Carberry led the Mountaineers in scoring with 10 goals and 1 assist. Kearns, a fullback, and Pequignot, a halfback, each led a strong defensive unit and still were able to record 2 goals, 1 assist, and 1 goal, 1 assist respectively.

Other seniors also played leading roles:

forward lineman Patti Mulligan, Barbie Baird, and Cheryl MacRitchie, all contributed heavily to the offensive scoring, with MacRitchie scoring 7 goals and Mulligan scoring 4 goals and 3 assists. Halfbacks Stacey Dodge and Laurie Hall keyed the defensive unit protecting goal keeper, Leslie Ovitt.

The 1980 Housatonic soccer season was one of the best in recent memory; the Mountaineers, for only the third time in the school's history, went to the state tournament, where they became the first squad to win a tournament game with a 2-1 win over Ellington.

Any discussion of the Mountaineers has to begin with senior co-captains Rick Sieller and Tim Brown. Brown, a three year starter in goal who was named to the Class M All-State team and to the All-Berkshire League team, saved a miraculous 215 shots, an average of 13 a game. He allowed only 1.5 shots a game.

Sieller, who was also named to the All-Berkshire League team, led the squad in scoring with 17 goals and 5 assists.

Backing up Sieller in the scoring column was sophomore Ron Laigle with 9 goals and 4 assists. Another leading scorer was junior Scott Taylor with 7 goals and 6 assists.

Keynoting the defense were seniors Marc Shores and Kari Salkunen — an exchange student from Finland — and junior Bill Pederson. Although many key players were seniors, a strong nucleus of underclassmen will return next season.

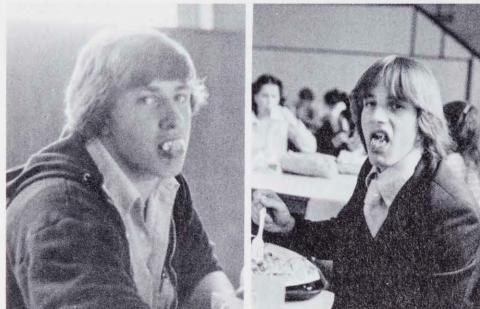
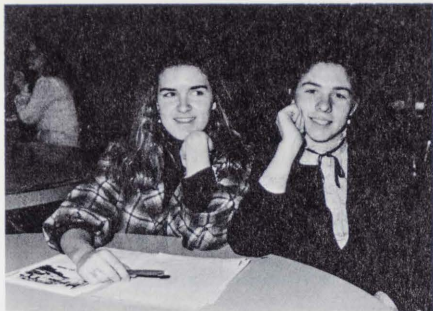
