This year's visitors included Katherine Fraser, Halsey Davis, Donald Junkins, Galway Kinnell, and "Moose Man" John Haines.

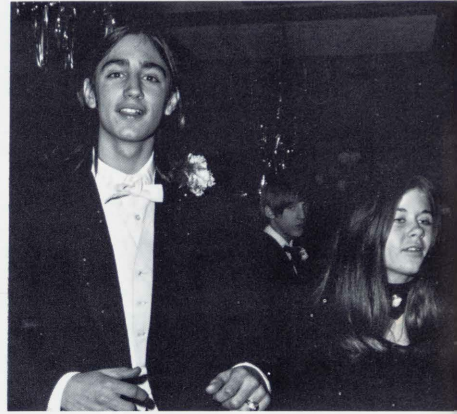

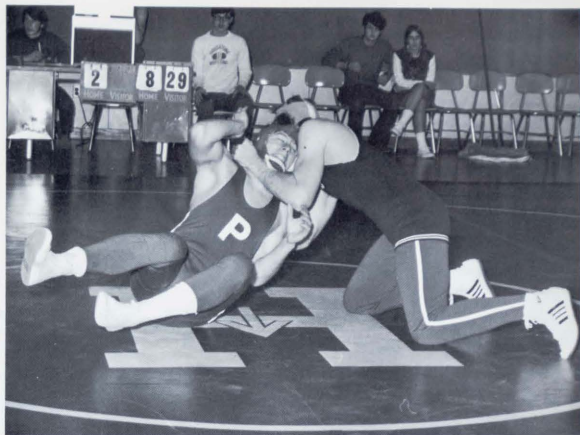
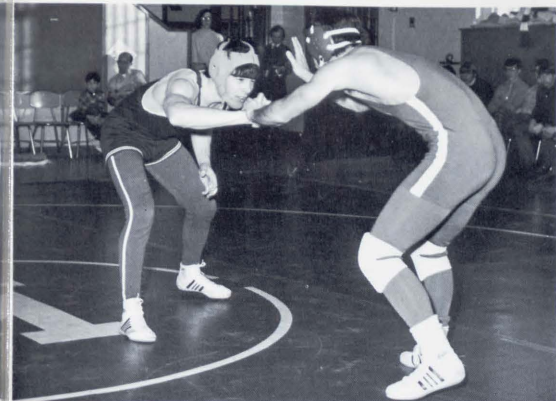
Coach Green feels that the underclassmen have a great potential. This very interesting sport should continue to grow at Regional as soon as fans learn more about the particulars of the sport.
