Hosted by the Downs family in Falls Village Ahmad Kheir was the first Lebanese AFS student at HVRHS. He considered HVRHS to be a huge school physically until he noticed it had about 430 students unlike his school in Lebanon that has 2,000 students in a physically smaller campus. Both schools are similar in that both are there to enrich its students with a high level education and both have amazing teachers. In Lebanon, students stay in their classes while the teachers move from class to class. There is a more theoretical curriculum while Housy has a more hands on curriculum. Ahmad enthusiastically recommends participating in the AFS program because they deserve to experience a new culture that enriches them with knowledge and appreciation for other cultures. When it comes to challenges, food is an issue he feels every single exchange student should talk about. Ahmad says he became a more self-reliant person. In addition, AFS allows students to build special relationships with the HVRHS community. "Chicago The Musical" and the Mr. Housatonic competition were the biggest impacts on his school year since they were his first stage experiences. "I would like to thank HVRHS, its community, AFS and my host parents for being so hospitable and caring. I love v'all so much!" Ana de la Fuente Gil arrived from Spain to spend the year living in Sharon with the Kovacs-Nelson family. When she first arrived she felt as though she was in a movie. The houses, the people, everything looked like a giant Sims game or an MTV show...at least until she arrived in Sharon! "I couldn't believe it was a town, it looked so small and peaceful. I couldn't believe there were people living there," Ana says. But HVRHS was also one of those "this country is huge and full of huge things" moment. This school is twice as big as her school in Spain although her Spanish school has three times more students. Students cannot bring their phones to school and spend a great deal of money on books. Teachers are referred to by their first name, although no one would ever dare to joke with a teacher. Most people think the biggest challenge is the language, but Ana feels the biggest shock comes when you see how, although you've been getting ready for the experience

for months, speaking the language is the smallest of your concerns. You just keep staring at people when they talk, not because you don't understand what they are saying, but because you don't understand why are they saying what they are saying! She learned that it is not as easy as it seems and a little extra help is always welcomed. She believes one of the biggest contributions of AFS is not only diversity, but the opportunity to experience how big this world is yet how similar the people are who occupy it. Also, hearing people from abroad talking about their home countries makes one want go to those places and creates a desire for traveling, which she thinks is one of the best things a person can do with her time.

Parker, Abigail LaFontan, Annie Besmer and distance runner Mari Culterton. During the two day festival, Lauren and Angela won Gold and


