



Conducted at Lime Rock Park in May, the race consisted of driving around the autocross track. The car that completed the most laps within the hour won. This year our car completed 19 laps. The Who's CTEKS Robotics team had some remarkable achievements this year. This year's project was a game called "Aerial Assist" in which two competing alliances of three robots each tried to outscore their opponents. The team competed at two district events and one district championship. The first event was held at Worcester Polytechnic Institute (WPI) in Worcester, MA. The team was seeded #1 out of 40 team with 13 wins/4 losses. They made it to the semi-finals. They received the "Innovation In Control Award". The second event was held at Hartford Public High School in March. The team was seeded #7 out of 39 teams with 8 wins/6 losses, advancing to the quarterfinals. The district championship was held at the Agganis Arena in Boston in April. The team was seeded #5 out of 54 teams with 11 wins/6 losses. They made it to the semi-finals once again.

With the assistance of their alliance partners, team #716 also had the highest record score of any match during the district competition (316 to 79). Overall the team was ranked #9 out 163 teams in New England. This ranking qualified the team for First World Championship held at the Edwards Jones


Students participated in this year's North American Envirothon in Montana in the summer of 2013 and placed 8th out of 54 teams from the United States and Canada. Throughout the year three teams worked with enthuasiam and passion with environmental professionals from around the state in the areas of forest science, wildife biology, soil science & land-use, aquatics, and the North American issue, sustainable agriculture. Our Housatonic teams placed second and fourth out of 48 teams from around the state and our wildcard team placed first among six teams. Mr. Moran would like to wish the very best to our outgoing seniors for a life filled with conservation, stewardship and a strong land ethic.

Since 1950, Housatonic has worked with American Field Service to host students from around the world at our school as well as to send our students to foreign countries for an immersion in language and culture unlike anything they can experience at home. Our students benefit from both ends of the exchange, relating to those students and welcoming them into our "family" for the year, and bringing a world of experiences back to share after living abroad. This year HVRHS was recognized as one of the Top AFS Schools for 2014 "that have demonstrated a strong commitment to enhancing global education in distinctive ways." Mary O'Reilly, Spanish teacher and coordinator of the program, has enhanced our international exchanges with her recent trip to Panama and her continued connection to Latin America, efforts that were recognized by AFS in their award.


